1. Epitaph of Georgiou, Bishop of Ibrim

LDUCE-UC2373. Found in the fill of Tomb T2, in the Cathedral cemetery terrace, west of the South Church, Ibrim, lower Nubia. Rectangular slab of sandstone.

Pashshe. O Christ God, rest his soul in the bosom of Abraham and Isaac and Jacob, whence pain and grief and lamentations have fled away, in the splendour of Your saints, in the paradise of joy, Amen.

2. Epitaph of Aristoneikos, brother of Didymos

LDUCE-UC14537. Stele of limestone found at Koptos. Round top, divided into three registers. The mummified deceased is depicted introduced by Anubis before Osiris and Isis; four lines of Greek at bottom. Dimensions: h. 580mm, w. 375mm.

LDUCE-UC14764. Part of coarse limestone cylinder with a depression in the top; inscribed in five lines of Greek with dedication by Hermaios to Isis for a fair voyage for the ship Sarapis. From Koptos. Dimensions: h. 310 mm





16. Stele for Pebos son of Petearchpokates

LDUCE-UC14776. Sandstone (or coarse limestone) stele, with winged disk at top and two pendant uraei above mummy (of Osiris ?) in boat, with jackal on either side in top register. In middle register was—sceptre at either side, Isis standing (with red colour on disk between horns on head) behind Osiris enthroned facing right to offering table, Anubis standing at right facing left presenting upright mummy left-facing; bottom register three-line inscription in Demotic, starting with the formula ‘may there live the ba-soul of Pabes son of Padihorpakhered, then two lines of Greek (see below).

Left: Osiris enthroned with Isis standing behind, before table of offerings. On right: Anubis presenting standing mummy of deceased. Lower register: inscription in Greek.


